This 87-minute documentary directed by EMMY® Award-winning filmmaker Sophia Kruz and cinematographer Meena Singh (HOLLIDAYSBURG, 20 FEET FROM STARDOM), with music by Sundance Composing Lab alumni Amritha Vaz (500 DAYS OF SUMMER), was produced over a period of 18 months in Senegal, Kenya, Brazil, Germany, India and USA. The film and accompanying education initiative have been designed to raise awareness about global women's rights issues, and to celebrate creative, entrepreneurial, and arts-therapy based solutions to the most pressing challenges facing women globally. Attendees will have access to the free **Little Stones Educational Toolkit** from Michigan State University to apply its teachings in our community and worldwide.
